FROM OUR REGULAR CORRESPONDENT-

THE RAILROAD WILL BUILD NO DEPOT BUILDINGS HERE, NOR WILL THEY HAVE ANY DEPOT GROUNDS.

MEASRS. REESE AND REDMAN WILL BUILD PLATFORMS AND WAREHOUSES TO ACCOMMODATE SHIPPERS AND RECEIVERS OF FREIGHT. THIS IS A VERY ENTERPRISING FORM.

IT IS SAID MR. REESE WILL SELL OUT HIS BUSINESS IN WESTON TO PORTLAND PARTIES.

THE TRACK OF O.R. & N. LINE WILL RUN WITHIN A FOURTH OF A MILE OF TOWN.

A NEAT TWO STORY HOTEL IS IN COURSE OF CONSTRUCTION HERE, AND WILL SOON BE FINISHED.

SHORTLY THE POST OFFICE AND EXPRESS OFFICE WILL BE IN OPERATION, AND THEN THE STAGES WILL STOP HERE.

MR. REDMAN IS HAVING A NEAT RESIDENCE ERECTED IN TOWN.

LUMBER FOR BUILDING IN ADAMS CITY IS PURCHASED IN PENDLETON.

A LARGE NUMBER OF MEN AND TEAMS ARE BUSY AT WORK ON THE RAILROAD GRADE IN FRONT OF TOWN.

A LARGE QUANTITY OF WHEAT IS BEING HAULED FROM HERE TO CAYUSE A NUMBER OF PERSONS HAVE PURCHASED LOTS HERE AND ARE PREPARING TO BUILD.
