

# Adams American December 2023

#### Council

A big thank you to all who helped organize and cook the Adams Community Thanksgiving Dinner.

Residents are asked to pack their meters for the winter to prevent freezing. If a water meter is not packed and freezes, the homeowner is responsible for the cost of a new meter.

The Adams Community Benefit Plan Board met on November 6, 2023, at noon. They approved reimbursement payments to the Triangle Little League for the remaining funds on their grant and the Adams Friends Association for the purchase of a barbeque The Board will meet again in February of 2024.

The Adams City Council held the first reading of Ordinance #269 Regulating ATVs in the City Limits. The second reading is set for the December 18, 2023, meeting.

Measure 56, which was passed by the voters, requires that notices be sent out to all property owners in the city limits. The city is required to send out this notice if they are contemplating any zoning changes or ordinances that might affect the uses and/or value of affected properties. Ordinance #265-Livestock Ordinance will have its first reading on December 18, 2023, meeting with a public hearing. If you would like a copy of the proposed ordinance, you can contact City Hall. Ordinance #265 will be posted in the Post Office as well. All City Council meetings are open to the public and you can also 'ZOOM' in.

A big THANK YOU goes out to all the water customers that filled out and returned the information update form. We are trying to put together a means of contacting customers in the event of a water emergency or to let them know we need to shut off the water at their house or on their street.

If you have cans to donate, the Adams Public Library is accepting can donations. Proceeds from the cans go to special programs and events planned through the library. You can drop them by the back door any time! (Continued on back page...)

The City of Adams has an intergovernmental agreement with Umatilla County to provide code enforcement. They have a new officer on the job and his name is Rich Estes. He will be conducting weekly patrols through Adams. Code enforcement will be looking for all solid wastes such as garbage, street refuse, industrial waste, demolition and construction materials, and structures built from unacceptable building materials. Also included is scrap metal and wood, discarded home appliances, manure, dead animals, ashes, putrescible materials, and rubbish that is hazardous to public health and safety, annoying or offensive and/or unsightly.

Solid waste is also considered to be vehicles that are inoperable and/or unlicensed or being used as parts for other vehicles and discarded engine parts. Tires or oil drained from vehicles are also considered solid waste and require special disposal methods. The Department of Environmental Quality can assist you in properly disposing of these hazardous materials. If you have an inoperable or unlicensed vehicle that you are restoring, it must be kept within a structure. Tarps of canopied structures do not qualify as a structure for vehicle restoration.


The Teen Advisory Board will be meeting on Sunday, December 10th at 1:00pm. Their last event, a
