NEW CITY COUNCILORS TAKE THE OATH OF OFFICE

Three Councilors took the oath of office and began their terms which will end on December 31, 2028.

They are John Thompson who was re-elected and Justin Stewart and Ethan Colvard, newly elected last November, 2024. Councilor Thompson has served many terms on the Council. Councilors Stewart and Colvard are new to the Council. Councilor Colvard served on the Planning Commission before deciding to move to the City Council.

HISTORY OF ADAMS VOLUME I 1883-1893 PART 7

OCTOBER 12, 1883

FROM OUR REGULAR CORRESPONDENT

WOOD IS NOW SELLING FOR \$6 PER CORD IN ADAMS AND IS SCARCE AT THAT.

I AM INFORMED BY OUR BLACKSMITH THAT HE HAD ONE TON OF ENGLISH COAL LAID DOWN AT HIS SHOP I ADAMS FOR \$24.

SCHOOL WILL BEGIN IN WORTHINGTON'S HALL AS SOON AS THE BUILDING IS COMPLETED.

MESARS. LUCY AND DOZIER ARE EACH HAVING MATERIAL HAULED ON THE GROUND FOR A NEW DWELLING.

"CHEAP CHARLEY" IS DISPOSING OF HIS STOCK OF COAL OIL, LAMPS, AND PIPES BY SHAKING DICER, TO SEE WHO WILL TAKE 'EM.

MCCOY AND KING RECEIVED LAST EVENING A NEW SUPPLY OF WHITE LEAD AND OIL, WHICH WILL BE SOLD AT THE LOWEST MARKET PRICE.

MESARS. REESE AND REDMAN HAVE SHIPPED 33,327 BUSHEL OF WHEAT FROM CAYUSE STATION TO DATE. THEY ARE BUYING AT THE RATE OF 1000 BUSHEL OF WHEAT PER DAY.

THE MISSOURIANS BOARDING AT THE HOWELL HOUSE ALL WEAR A BLAND GRIN NOW, AND IT IS SAID THAT THE CAUSE OF IT IS THAT HOWELL IS FURNISHING THE TABLE WITH CORN BREAD AND BLACK HAWS.

JOHN ADAMS AND BROS. WILL ERECT A \$30,000 FLOURING MILL AT ADAMS THIS COMING SPRING. SOME WORK WILL BE DONE THIS FALL IN THE WAY OF HAULING TIMBERS AND GETTING THE GROUNDS READY.

MR. O'BRIEN CORRALLED 86 HEAD OF BEEF CATTLE IN HIS LIVERY STABLE CORRAL LAST NIGHT. HE SAID THAT HE WAS GOING TO DRIVE THEM TO PENDLETON TODAY AND WOULD LIKELY SHIP FROM THERE TO PORTLAND.

AN EMIGRANT FROM MISSOURI, WHO LATELY CAME OVER THE N.P., SAID THAT A VOTE WAS TAKEN IN ONE OF THE EMIGRANT CARS FOR PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES WHICH RESULTED ON A MAJORITY OF 45 OUT OF 51 VOTES CAST FOR TILDEN. THIS LOOKS AS THOUGH THE EMIGRATION WAS LARGELY DEMOCRATIC, AT LEAST IN ONE CAR.

Before you build-

- The maximum allowable height of fences and walls is 7 feet.
- The height of fences and walls abutting a rear alley, shall not exceed 7 feet.
- The height of fences and walls within a front yard setback shall not exceed 4 feet.
- Areas Where Fences Require Permits- For purposes of safety, fences require permits if being built in the following districts:
- Flood Hazard Overlay Zone (Chapter 3.7)
- Floodway Zone (Chapter 3.7)
