Kelly will be working part time to help him learn all the facets of the job.

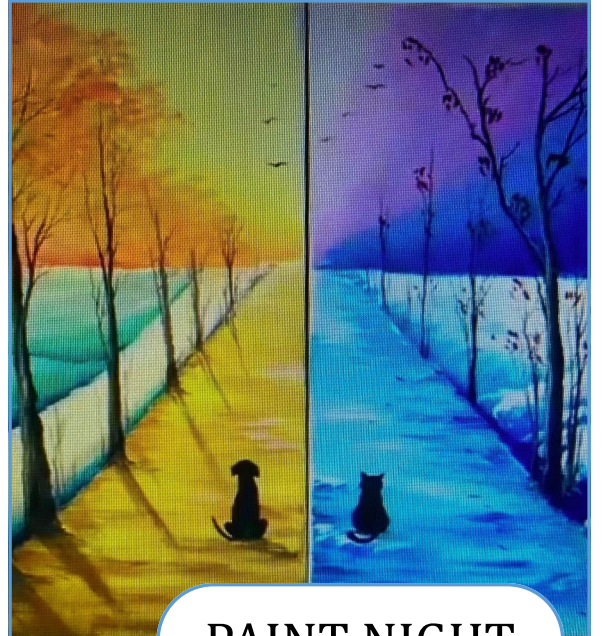
The new playground structure has been delivered and will be installed in the spring when the weather allows. It will be great to see the park full of children again.
