MARCH 3, 1885

PROSPERITY PROMISED FOR ADAMS

THE ADAMS CORRESPONDENT OF THE **LEADER** WRITES:

TIMES ARE IMPROVING. THE CHANGE IS SCARCELY PERCEPTIBLE AS YET, BUT THE STATE OF AFFAIRS HAS ARRIVED AT SO LOW AN EBB THAT THE SLIGHTEST CHANGE IS PERCEPTIBLE. THE IMPROVEMENT IS NOTICEABLE IN THE AMOUNT OF WORK GOING ON IN OUR BLACKSMITH SHOPS, WAGON SHOPS AND CARPENTER SHOPS. THARP BROTHERS ARE BUSY FROM MORNING TO NIGHT, WITH THREE MEN EMPLOYED. THEY INFORM ME THAT THEY HAVE TWO MORE MONTHS WORK ON HAND. NEXT WEEK THEY WILL HAVE ANOTHER MAN, MAKING FOUR IN ALL. JIMMIE LIEUALLEN, ACROSS THE WAY, IS CONSTANTLY AT WORK WITH ONE SMITH BESIDES HIMSELF, MAKING SIX BLACKSMITHS IN TOWN WITH MORE WORK THAN THEY CAN DO.

VINING BROTHERS AND HARVEY COOK WAGON MAKERS, ARE JUST AS BUSY. THEY ARE BUILDING TWO SPRING WAGONS, ONE FOR BUTCHER, MR. CALVERT, AND ONE FOR A GENTLEMEN IN CENTERVILLE (ATHENA) BOTH AS GOOD AS THE FINEST IMPORTED HACKS.

THE FARMERS ARE JOYOUS IN ANTICIPATION OF GOOD TIMES AND PLENTY OF WORK IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

MONEY HAS BEEN RAISED BY SUBSCRIPTION AND OTHERWISE TO BUILD
