**ORDINANCE # 271**

**AN ORDINANCE DEFINING STREET STANDARDS IN THE CITY OF ADAM, OREGON**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Adams adopted a Comprehensive Plan, Development Code and Transportation System Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Adams Development Code, Table 3.4.100-City of Adams Street Standards and the City of Adams Transportation Plan Chapter 3:Transportation System Inventory-Street System-City Street Classification offer conflicting definitions; and

**WHEREAS**, the street standards and classifications need to be standardized between the two documents until such time as the documents are updated to reflect these changes;

**THE CITY OF ADAMS DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 1. Short Title.** This ordinance may be referred to as the “City of Adams Street Standardization Ordinance.”

**SECTION 2. Definitions.** As used in this ordinance, the following mean:

- A. Arterials.** Arterials form the primary roadway network within and through the region. They provide a continuous road system that distributes traffic between cities, neighborhoods, and districts. Generally arterials are high capacity roadways carrying high traffic volume entering or leaving the City. Right of Way-80 feet.
- B. Collectors.** Collectors serve traffic within the commercial, industrial, and residential neighborhood areas. They connect local neighborhoods or districts to the arterial network. Collectors help form part of the grid system; however, they are not intended to function as alternative routes to the arterial system. Right of Way-60 feet.
- C. Local/Residential Streets.** Local streets provide access to all parcels of land and serve travel over relatively short distances. They are designed to carry the very low traffic volumes associated with the local uses that abut them. Through traffic movements are discouraged on local streets. Right of Way-50 feet.

**SECTION 3. Arterials.** In Adams, only OR Highway 11 (Oregon-Washington Highway) functions as an arterial.

**SECTION 4. Collectors.** Old Highway 11 from OR 11 to Springhollow, East Commercial from city boundary to north Main Street, Main Street (north and south) from city boundary to Preston Street, College street from city boundary to Preston street, Preston Street (east and west) from College Street to Old Highway 11.

**SECTION 5. Local/Residential Streets.** All other streets not mentioned above.

**SECTION 5. Severability.** If any provision, section sentence, clause phrase or other part of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts.

**SECTION 7. Effective Date.** The Ordinance enacted by the City Council of Adams shall take effect on the thirtieth day after its enactment.
